NYWEA's 2008 Spring Technical Conference and Exhibition
June 1-4 in Lake George, NY – Theme is the Hudson River

Syracuse - With the theme, "The Hudson River," the New York Water Environment Association (NYWEA) is bringing together experts on water quality issues from around the state to Lake George, NY for its annual Spring Technical Conference and Exhibition on June 1-4, 2008. NYWEA is a statewide, nonprofit membership organization of 2,300 environmental engineers and water quality management professionals.

The meeting, which takes place at The Sagamore Hotel, includes 10 technical sessions, with two sessions devoted to issues facing the Hudson River Estuary and its water quality. Other session topics include water pollution control, sustainability and asset management, watershed issues, wet weather concerns, public education, emerging technologies and procurement, and funding. Also planned are a number of special networking events, area sightseeing tours, NYWEA's Operations Challenge, along with a vendor exhibition showcasing manufacturers and services for the water and wastewater industry.

The opening session on Monday morning (June 2) includes a welcoming address by NYWEA President Robert Kukenberger, PE, with other invited speakers to include: John Stouffer from the NYS Comptroller's Office; James Tierney, NYSDEC assistant commissioner; and Robert Bullock with the Hudson-Fulton-Champlain Quadricentennial Commission.
