**NYWEA Honors Steven Fangmann, P.E., of Syosset, NY
with Board Service Award and Induction into Hall of Fame**

Syracuse – The New York Water Environment Association (NYWEA), a statewide organization of leaders in water quality management, awarded professional engineer Steven A. Fangmann of Syosset, NY the 2008 Board of Directors Service Award at the 81st Annual NYWEA Meeting held in New York City last month. The NYWEA membership also inducted Fangmann into its Hall of Fame.

A board certified environmental engineer, Fangmann has been an active member of the NYWEA Long Island Chapter for 33 years. Fangmann is completing his term as Long Island Representative to NYWEA's state board and is past chairman of the Long Island Chapter, serving on its board from 1984 to 1999. Since 2000, he has served as the chairman of the NYWEA Clean Water Funding Task Force.

Fangmann is Executive Vice President of Dvirka and Bartilucci Consulting Engineers in Woodbury, NY. Fangmann also directs the firm's Wastewater Collection and Treatment Division. He has extensive civil and environmental engineering experience in the private and municipal sectors, including 16 years of service with the Nassau County Department of Public Works. He holds a bachelor's and a master's degree in civil/environmental engineering from Manhattan College. Fangmann lives in Syosset with his wife, Lucia, and they have two daughters.

Founded in 1929 by professionals in the field of water quality as a nonprofit educational organization, NYWEA has 2,500 members statewide who historically
